The Nootbaar fellow serves as the point person for the expanding plea bargaining and public defender initiatives, as well as the Pepperdine liaison in the High Court of Uganda for one year, beginning in August of 2020. The Fellow is responsible for running the plea bargaining and public defender initiatives, for maintaining good relationships with the judiciary, and for coordinating the housing and court placements of summer Global Justice interns in Uganda. He or she will also help coordinate any other programs or projects that arise between Pepperdine and the judiciary during that year. The Fellow will be paid a stipend of \$40,000 for the year. We will assist the Fellow with finding housing. The beginning term will overlap at least one week with the current Fellow for training and cultural orientation.
